Another way is to hold the wafer/bread until the chalice is administered and dip just a small edge into the cup. **Please make sure fingers do not dip into the wine. If you don't want to receive the wine; simply cross your arms.** If you would like to come up in solidarity to those around simply come up and cross your arms. Children are invited to receive, if parents have prepared them.*
