FAQs

Q: Do I have to audition?

Not if you don't want to. But if you DO audition, it helps figure out which part you'll sing (i.e. soprano, alto, tenor, bass.) Auditions take place in the choir room, in private, and are quick and painless.

Q: Do I have to be able to read music?

Not necessarily. It helps, but you'll find we learn a lot of music by repetition and rote.

Q: Why do we need a choir?

To enhance our worship and support congregational singing. To make a joyful noise.

Q: How much of a time commitment is it?

One and half hours on Wednesday nights starting at 7:00 p.m.
We meet at 9:15 a.m. Sunday mornings to warm up and then sing during the 10:00 a.m. service.
